Hong Kong Legal System

Question 1 (50 marks)

The current Chairman of the Hong Kong Bar Association, Victor Dawes SC, said the following at the Opening of Legal Year 2023:

"[The] focus of the legal community and the public [in 2023] will no doubt be on the various high profile public order and NSL trials that will be heard this year. We will have to demonstrate that defendants at the receiving end of the most serious allegations will be dealt with fairly and impartially. We owe a duty to society to ensure that the justice system, and in particular the trial process, is effective, fair, and compliant with the rule of law."

Discuss critically with reference to decided cases the impact of the NSL upon the criminal trial system in Hong Kong.

Question 2 (50 marks)

One scholar has said the following recently:

"Under the 'One Country, Two Systems' principle, Hong Kong still remains a common law jurisdiction. Although Hong Kong's legal system is largely separated from the mainland one, there are many interfaces between the two legal systems."

(Hong Kong Lawyer, March 2023, p. 73)

Application of the Constitution of the PRC in Hong Kong, application of such national laws as listed in Annex III, and interpretation of the Basic Law are three of the five interfaces mentioned by him.
